The Project

The **UWUPP** project aims at strengthening the Umbrella Organisations through a partnership with 5 different Austrian sector institutions by a mutual exchange of experiences and know-how.

The Austrian partners represent various approaches for sustainable **O&M** of water supply schemes and include a private operator (*Salzburg AG*), an umbrella organization (*Upper Austria Water*), a national association (*OVGW*), an international association of water works (*IAWD*, lead partner) and a large city water work (*Vienna Water*). UWUPP is funded by the **EU** through the Africa-EU Water Facility.

Umbrella Organizations

An Umbrella Organisation (UO) is an association of Water Supply & Sewerage Boards in a particular region on a voluntary basis, installed to pool resources and ideas for achieving sustainable water & sanitation services. Typical UO activities offered to their members are <u>training</u>, <u>advice</u>, <u>support</u>, <u>services</u>.

An UOs is an entity registered under the company act of Uganda. It is governed by a General Assembly of its members and an Executive Committee (including representatives from Ministry for Water and Environment). The operating unit is a secretariat headed by an Umbrella Manager.

The five Ugandan UOs (North, East, Centre, South-West, Mid-West) are supported by MWE on the basis of a Memorandum of Understanding and are coordinating their activities closely with the respective Water & Sanitation Development Facilities.

The Ugandan Concept


Investments in infrastructure are managed decentralised through 4 <u>Water</u> and Sanitation Development Facilities (WSDF).

For **Operation & Maintenance** (O&M) of this infrastructure a contractual framework is employed. Responsibility for the sustainable use of infrastructure is transferred to a gazetted <u>Water Supply & Sewerage Authority</u> (WSSA) through a **Performance Contract** between Government of Uganda and the WSSA. Responsibility for technical operation and management of the scheme is normally delegated to a Private Operator through a **Management Contract** between the WSSA and a licensed company. <u>Water Supply & Sanitation Boards</u> (WSSB) including water user representatives are installed for management oversight.

For strengthening and developing the WSSA's and WSSB's capacities 5 <u>Umbrella Organisations</u> (UO) for Water & Sanitation have been founded to support sustainable O&M throughout Uganda.

Operation & Maintenance Concept

Good O&M is key for sustaining good coverage levels and safeguarding Water Safety – a possible perspective for a comprehensive framework:



Challenges for the UO approach

- Continuously increasing numbers of UO members raise the need for adapted operational structures.
- Innovative approaches must be introduced to reach all members in large regions with many remote areas.
- Standardized training and educational systems are the basis for sustainable capacity development and will need to be established.
- Responsibilities of stakeholders within the wider formal framework and the respective links between them need to be clearly defined and agreed upon.
- Sustainable UO services require a sustainable financial basis and suitable capacities (staff, transport, equipment)
